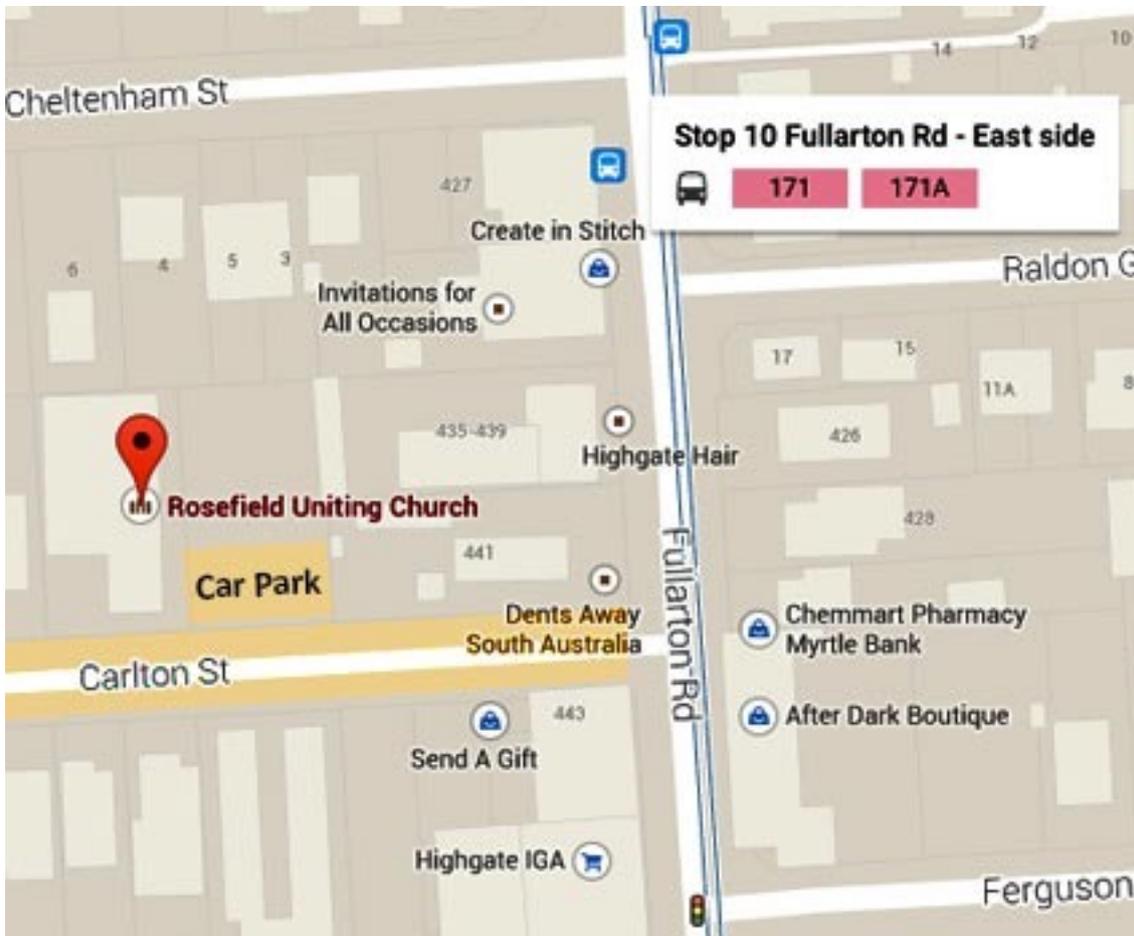

Miscellany

These items are a bit esoteric, so may not be relevant to many members. I hope they are of interest to some ...

Erasing a DVD-RW in El Capitan (more!):

Last month I wrote about not being able to erase (format) a DVD-RW (a "Rewritable" DVD) using Disk Utility on my iMac, which now has El Capitan (OS X 10.11) on it. The Erase function was just greyed out.

But fellow SAAUC member Rick Sarkanen had the answer—which does not involve the use of Disk Utility.

This is what you do:

- Load the DVD-RW you want to erase;
- When it mounts, click on its icon to select it;
- Right/Control click on it;
- Select the option Erase rewritable disc <XYZ>

And that does it!

Moving to Photos from iPhoto in El Capitan:

If you've been using iPhoto to manage your photos and you now upgrade to El Capitan, you take on the new Photos app.

"What does Photos do to my iPhoto library?" you ask.

A Macintouch reader, Hugh Lovell, provided a good answer:

When Photos is run for the first time, it does not duplicate the existing iPhoto library.

What it does is to read the original image files and create a new index to them.

In the Finder, this looks like a new, separate library taking up about as much space as the original library.

But in fact, it's only taking up a relatively small amount of space because it's just a new index and other supporting infrastructure. When the old iPhoto library is deleted you'll see you don't get back the free space you might expect, again because you're deleting the old iPhoto indexing and infrastructure. The original images are retained and are now indexed by the new Photos library.

Some Apple History

Introduction of the Macintosh Portable on September 20th, 1989:



A Macintosh reader offered this bit of Apple history in late February:

A propos of nothing in particular, I happened across this video of Jean Louis Gassé's introduction of the Macintosh Portable on September 20th, 1989, in which he, with understated, self-deprecating humour, assembles a Macintosh Portable (with nary an antistatic strap in sight) from its constituent modular parts (including a "new, low-power 2,400 bps modem" card and a lead-acid battery the size of a pound of butter), each part of which he pulls from an upright footlocker, all the while ably explaining the new technologies used, and when it's complete, turns it on and ... you'll have to watch to see what happens! I found this completely charming, and just wanted to share.

Geoff Perkins Presentation

A brief report on our February Meeting

Geoff shared some stories about himself.

When a High School Student, Geoff and his classmates were asked “What do you want to be *if* you grow up?” The teacher would not accept his honest answers, they were too creative. He said, a “**Music Producer**”, - a “**TV Producer**” and then to avoid further ridicule, a “**Teacher**” which was accepted though his third choice was actually “**Journalist**”.

Later in life he did become a Teacher and still is, however, his earlier passions never left him. Being an immigrant from the UK over 50 years ago, on the anniversary, his family went back to their roots even visiting the old family home.

As it was for sale, they were able to do a virtual walk through with their iPads. On return, Geoff put pictures from the trip and some family history together creating a book.

Around 50 years after that school encounter, **Geoff had become a Journalist.**

Geoff likes the Beatles, Revolver was the first album he bought, using Garage Band, then Logic Pro, Geoff recorded himself playing and singing his favourite song from Revolver, “She said, she said”,

Geoff became a Music Producer.

At family celebrations Geoff and mates became the entertainment (he plays guitar) and decided to record this using three video cameras and edit the video later. Three hours X3 (9 hours, 4 Terabytes) of video were taken and edited to make the shorter movie. The software synced the three recordings and the Ken Burns effect enabled some zooming of the action.

Geoff had become a TV Producer. (The iMac used to edit is the highest spec available!)

Geoff brought along a new iPad Pro and Apple Pencil as we anticipated.

The size and quality is very impressive, apart from being bigger, the Pro and Apple Pencil have been marketed as creative tools.

Geoff gave a demo of how the Pencil can be used for drawing although he shared that he is no artist. The demo showed a little of what is possible now and more will be possible as more creative software becomes available.

As with the Mac, the iPad Pro and Pencil will help people pursue their dreams and change lives.

Geoff’s main story was about “Quality of life – Me & my Mac” what the Mac has made possible and how it continues to enrich his life.
